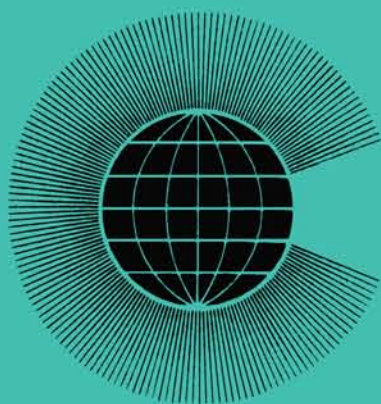

INTRODUCTION

The Directory of Universities and Other Institutions of Higher Education in the Commonwealth of Nations Offering Qualifications and Courses in Educational Administration was first published in 1974 by the Commonwealth Council for Educational Administration.

This revision of the Directory has been undertaken by CCEA for publication in the Commonwealth Secretariat's series Education in the Commonwealth. Material appearing in the first edition has been updated and further institutions have been listed.

The opportunity has also been taken to shorten the title to: Commonwealth Directory of Qualifications and Courses in Educational Administration.

It is hoped that the Directory will prove a useful reference and guide to the governments and institutions within the Commonwealth that are recognizing the importance of educational administration as a field of study. This edition is published jointly by the Commonwealth Council for Educational Administration and the Commonwealth Secretariat which financed the publication through its Commonwealth Fund for Technical Co-operation.

THE COMMONWEALTH COUNCIL FOR EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

The Council has its headquarters on the campus of the University of New England, Armidale, Australia and its two and a half thousand members are spread throughout the Commonwealth of Nations.

Now in its seventh year, the Council is controlled by a Board on which the various geographical regions of the Commonwealth and the larger national groups are represented. It is assisted by grants from the Commonwealth Foundation and is serviced by the University of New England.

Apart from the Directory the Council publishes a quarterly Newsletter and also Studies in Educational Administration. Its major aims are to foster a high standard in the practice and study of educational administration, to hold Commonwealth wide and regional conferences on various aspects of educational administration; to facilitate the dissemination of knowledge about research and practice in educational administration; to foster high standards in the preparation of administrators; to facilitate the exchange between member countries of teachers, students and practitioners of educational administration and to encourage the establishment in Commonwealth countries of national associations of those concerned with the improvement of educational administration. Through its network of regional and national groups it provides a widespread channel of communication for those in the field.

It gives priority to providing practical assistance to educational administrators in the newer countries of the Commonwealth and has conducted a number of seminars for school principals and administrators in the Pacific, South East Asia, the Caribbean and Malta.

Membership of the Council is open to anyone in the Commonwealth who is interested in the administration of education. A publications subscription is available for educational administrators who live outside the Commonwealth and wish to obtain the Council's publications.

On average 4 students from other parts of the Commonwealth are enrolled each year. Financial assistance for mature students is available in the form of post-graduate research scholarships; for the Diploma in Tertiary Education financial assistance in the form of Kellogg scholarships and fellowships is available to students from the South-West Pacific area.

Also offers, at post-graduate level, educational administration courses which can be credited to M.A., M.Ed.(Hons) or M.Ed.

The programme is commenced in the summer preceding the academic year in which the student enrolls. Students in this programme are eligible to apply for a graduate teaching fellowship with a value of \$2800 Canadian.

- . course structure - 4 full courses (24 hours) of which 2 are required courses in educational administration
- . 200 enrolled in 1975-76 (all part-time)

(2) M.Ed. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

- . minimum entrance requirements - 4-year bachelor's degree with acceptable level of achievement; related experience desirable
- . course structure - 5 full courses (30 hours) plus thesis; or 8 full courses (48 hours)

Some students come from other parts of the Commonwealth, 14 in 1975-76. They can receive financial help through graduate teaching and research assistantships if qualified to perform services required.

Planning for the future includes introduction of new courses to permit specialization in various aspects of educational administration.

A small core of courses and experiences constitutes the basic requirement of each degree programme. The balance of the programme is planned by the candidate and his advisor.

The main strengths of the graduate programmes are thought to be:

- (1) Flexibility - allowing a specially planned programme of study for each candidate
- (2) Theoretical-conceptual-clinical emphasis - based on a belief that technical training is best acquired through intern and on-the-job experiences
- (3) Tutorial relationships that develop between students and professor - largely because of accessibility and diverse backgrounds of staff
- (4) A wide choice of related courses from other university departments

New programmes and course offerings are being developed by the Centre in several fields - including such areas of interest as Policy Studies and Programme Development and Evaluation. Also, new materials are being developed for use in simulation training - both on campus and off.

- . minimum entrance requirements - first degree with B standing; satisfactory references
- . course structure - 8 courses, 2 compulsory and others from range of options; comprehensive examination with written and oral components
- . 70 enrolled in 1975

(3) M.A. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

- . minimum entrance requirements - B.Ed. or equivalent; strong academic background, interest in theory and research and in the practice of educational administration teaching experience
- . course structure - 6 full courses (3 in educational administration) including research seminar, field experience and thesis; programme normally requires 2 years, one in residence
- . 23 enrolled in 1975

(4) Ph.D. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

- . minimum entrance requirements - master's degree of high standing; teaching and administrative experience; personal interview, and satisfactory references
- . course structure - two alternatives; concentration on (1) requirements of the field practitioner, or on (2) requirements of the university teacher and researcher; the first alternative requires a report analysing a significant innovation in an education system; the second requires a research design; all students take an advanced theory seminar and an advanced research seminar; 2 years residence
- . full-time students in residence are eligible for financial assistance - \$1800(C) to \$3600 and remission of fees
- . 12 enrolled in 1975

Some students enrol from other parts of the Commonwealth and if qualified may be appointed to graduate teacher assistantships or graduate research assistantships plus remission of fees

Offers three qualifications in educational administration:

- (1) B.Ed. OR PRE-MASTER'S IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION
- . minimum entrance requirements - B.A. or equivalent and teacher's certificate
 - . course structure - five full-courses equivalents or 30 credit hours, 18 in educational administration; no thesis; there is provision for internships
 - . approximately 200 students in 1975-76

(2) M.Ed. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

- . minimum entrance requirements - B.A., B.Ed., or B.Ed. and Pre-Master's and 2 years teaching experience
- . course structure - 2 alternative programmes: the preparation and writing of a major thesis and 18 credit hours of course work; or 30 credit hours of course work and a comprehensive examination, or a research paper. The latter programme is not regarded as an adequate prerequisite for doctoral study
- . approximately 100 students in 1975-76

(3) Ph.D. IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

- . course structure - two years full-time, one spent in research, both years in residence; thesis required
