Description

In the first study, opinions of secondary school and teacher training college students on school strikes and discipline were analysed. The teacher training college students were found to be more involved in strikes and more militant in terms of favouring meeting student demands as a solution to strikes. They were also more concerned with what they found to be arbitrary rules hampering their personal freedom and with poor personal and recreational facilities at the colleges. The secondary school students, on the other hand, were more conciliatory, favouring discussion of student demands, and were concerned with educational as well as personal facilities.

In the second study a scale measuring attitudes of teachers towards disciplinary problems was constructed. It consisted of two forms of forty statements each, relating to both work problems and self-disciplinary problems. The third part of the investigation was a factorial analysis of the data obtained from the application of the discipline scale. Four Varimax factors emerged.

- (a) developing a conceptual framework as a guide-line for the study;
- (b) construction and validation of research instruments relating to concepts of number and shape among six-year olds;
- (c) administration of research instruments to approximately 1,000 subjects;
- (d) collation and analysis of raw data; and
- (e) publication of research findings.
